January Meeting Highlights





BCRW Membership Code of Conduct

The following standards and expectations related to membership activity and responsibility are hereby adopted by the Burnet County Republican Women (BCRW). The term “members” and its derivatives are used throughout this document to refer to active and associate members equally.

SECTION 1. Interaction and General Guidelines at Meetings

- a) Members are encouraged to socialize and network with other members, speakers, and guests at in-person meetings.
- b) Members shall treat all viewpoints, whether expressed by other members, speakers, or guests, with utmost respect and consideration, even when viewpoints differ, or when passion for a topic is heightened, or when expressing preference or distaste for a candidate or issue.
- c) Members shall refrain from inappropriate behavior on the property of which meetings or gatherings of BCRW are held.
- d) Members posing questions or expressing opinions before an audience at any BCRW meeting or event shall refrain from using foul language, controversial subject matter, or divisive speech.
- e) Members posing questions to a speaker shall be mindful of questions which may make speakers or audience members uncomfortable due to length or convolution of the question. If members need to speak on issues of that matter, the speaker may have time after the meeting if a member wishes to reach out to him or her.
- f) Political literature may not be passed out on the property where meetings are held, but may be placed on a designated table in the foyer or back of the room.

SECTION 2. General Conduct

- a) **Social Media.** Members are encouraged to respectfully express their own political viewpoints and positions on political campaigns and issues. Activities should not suggest representation of BCRW or

endorsement by BCRW.

b) **Bylaws.** Members are expected to abide by the bylaws of BCRW.

Membership Code of Conduct may be adopted or amended without previous notice by a majority vote of members present at any business meeting.

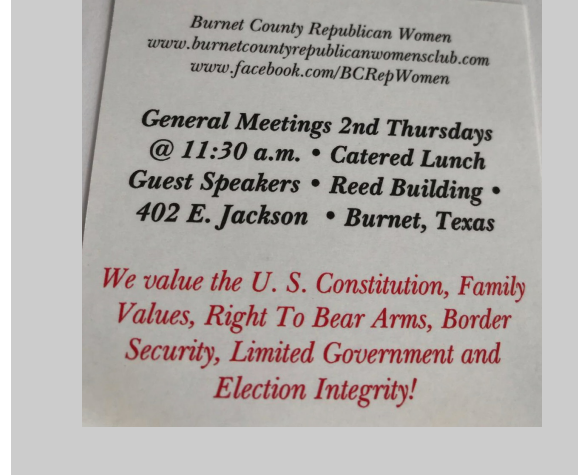

STOPS ON THE WAY TO CONVENTION

STOP 1

Precinct Convention

Check with your local Republican Party for the meeting date, time, and place. *Different for every county.* Held sometime after the polls close on Primary Election Day before the County/Senate District Conventions

What to expect: You can introduce and vote on resolutions. Then elect delegates and alternates to the next convention level.

STOP 2

County or SD Convention

Held on **March 23, 2024**. (same date for the entire state) Check with your Local Republican Party for location and time.

What to expect: Elect delegates and alternates to the state convention level. **Find out the process to become a state delegate. You may have to turn in an application and meet with the nominating committee.** In the days before the convention, you can visit committee meetings and let them know what issues are important to you. At the convention, you'll set the rules by which the convention will operate. You will vote on resolutions the committees have worked on that will be used to create the platform.

FINAL STOP

STATE CONVENTION - SAN ANTONIO

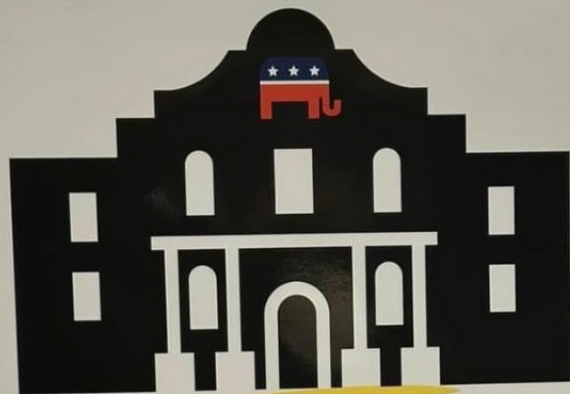
General Session and Caucuses will meet May 23rd-25th.

What to expect: **VOTE** on the platform that will state the beliefs of the Party, **VOTE** on the rules that will steer the Party, **VOTE** on the State Chair, State Vice-chair and your State Republican Committeeman and Committeewoman, the National Committeeman and National Committeewoman, and National Delegates, and Electors. Committees begin meeting on May 20th if you wish to go early and testify

January 2024 Minutes

Burnet County Republican Women
Minutes of General Meeting – January 11, 2024
Sylvester H. Reed Memorial Building – Burnet, Texas

Welcome, Call to Order, and Opening Ceremonies: President Mary Jane Avery welcomed everyone and called the meeting to order at 11:35 A.M., and a lunch was served. Commissioner Damon Beierle gave the invocation followed by the pledges to the American and Texas flags led by Brenda Miles.

Introductions: Mary Jane asked elected officials, precinct chairs, candidates, and guests to introduce themselves. Candidate literature and signs can be found on the table in the foyer.

Approval of Minutes: The December minutes were prepared by Darlene Hargett. They were published in the newsletter. There were no corrections or additions, so the minutes stand approved as distributed and published.

Treasurer's Report: Carolyn Richmond reported that we currently have \$42,908.15 in our operating account.

Membership: Janice Estill reported that we have 84 members. Our goal is 130. We will no longer use TicketSpice for lunch reservations or paying for membership. Those who paid in this way will be issued a refund. We will now use a service provided by First United Bank.

Scholarship: Kay Stripling explained the new scholarship application process. We present three \$1,000 scholarships each year to a senior from Burnet High School, Faith Academy, and Marble Falls High School. In addition to the school's application, applicants will complete an online application through the BCRW website. An in-person interview will be conducted with applicants selected by the Scholarship Committee. Scholarships will be awarded at our May meeting. Members of the Scholarship Committee are Rhonda Coleman, Mary Jane Avery, Kara Chasteen, Darlene Hargett, and Kay Stripling.

Caring For America: In February, we will collect money for scholarships. The goal is \$3,000.

Campaign Activities:

- Mike McCloskey, from John Carter's office, reported that there is a Zoom meeting tonight concerning the strike force for the New York election.
- Election workers are needed for the March 5th Primary. Please sign up.
- The Burnet County Candidate Forum is February 8, 2024 at the Burnet Community Center. The Meet and Greet is at 5:00 P.M., followed by the Forum at 6:00 P.M. Cookies are needed.
- The Burnet County Reagan Dinner is February 29, 2024 at Log Country Cove. Tickets are now on sale. Volunteers are needed to decorate. In addition, charger plates are needed. You may bring them to the February meeting.
- The Burnet County GOP Precinct and County Conventions will be held March 23, 2024, and the RPT State Convention is May 20-25, 2024 in San Antonio.
- The TFRW Leadership Day will be held in Georgetown on January 27, 2024.

Program: Gail Teegarden introduced our speaker, Toni Anne Dashiell, Texas National Committee Woman. Her topic was "The Road to Convention is the Road to the White House. You can help pave the way!" Ms. Dashiell explained the purpose of each convention:

- The Precinct Convention can be a committee of one. Delegates to go to the County Convention are chosen at the Precinct Convention. Nominees do not have to be present to be selected. In our county, the Precinct Convention and the County Convention will be held on March 23, 2024.
- An application must be completed in order to be selected to go to the State Convention. The State Convention selects one man and one woman to serve on the State Republican Executive Committee (SREC). Mary Jane currently represents our district. Other elections include a state Chair and Vice Chair, three delegates and three alternates to attend the National Convention, and a National Committee Woman and Man.
- At the Republican National Convention, the Republican platform and rules are developed and voted on, and delegates select their candidate for President.

Announcements:

- The Executive Committee meeting tonight is cancelled.
- Janice Estill reported that the Burnet County Republican Club meeting will be on January 29, 2024 at the Ragtime Oriole. Dinner is at 5:30 if desired, and the meeting begins at 6:15. The speaker will be a representative from Texas for Lawsuit Reform. Membership is

\$15.00.

- Invitations for the Reagan Dinner will be emailed next week.

The meeting was adjourned at 12:40 with the singing of "God Bless America" led by Carolyn Richmond.
